“Citizen Control of Personal Data”

Aim of initiative: The purpose of the “Citizen Control of Personal Data” initiative within the Marketplace can be summed up as helping to build the conditions and relationships, whereby the citizen will be willing to share personal data with a city and with other actors in the data economy.

Aim of workshop: To make a start in being able to demonstrate to cities, a means of valuing the data flows in the emerging European Data Model within their cities, in an easy to understand way. This is in order to encourage greater use and take-up of the technologies which will allow safe control for citizens safely sharing personal data, thus creating value.
