— Tell Me a Story - New SCIS Interview: SMART-FI Project



SCIS is interested in hearing your stories! We think (or hope) this has become clear by now. This month, we would therefore like to communicate yet another interesting story to you, but this time in the format of an interview. It is featuring the SMART-FI project and its story of how to get around Málaga in a smart way: It was not that long ago that a GPS tracking device installed in your car was a wonderful new technology, now it has integrated into our lives and become the norm rather than something exotic and strange. A car is also a carbon-intensive way of getting around, especially in a city with readily available public transport. As part of the SMART-FI project, a mobile application, CityGO, has been designed which assists the citizen or a visitor to navigate their way around Malaga as a pedestrian, a cyclist, by taking a bus or by resorting to a car if that is really the best option. Before we go into more detail about CityGO and its municipal counterpart, CityDash, first some background on the SMART-FI project.

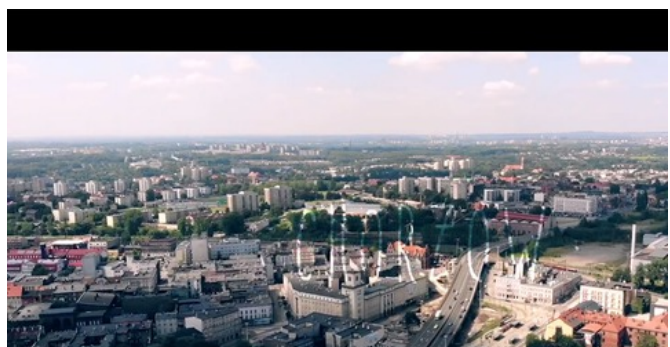

I Got the Key - SCIS Self Reporting Tool Instruction Webinars

Since a couple of months, the SCIS self-reporting tool (SRT) is available again for data input. For those that are not familiar with this tool: It facilitates the provision of so-called design and monitoring data for projects funded by the EU in the field of Smart Cities and Communities as well as Energy Efficiency projects in the built environment. Extensive maintenance was required to update data forms and to include forms that facilitate data supply for mobility and transport related as well as ICT oriented project activities. Based on the updated tool, the Self Reporting Guide has been updated and expanded. It now follows closely the various forms in its explanation of the data entry and supporting calculations.

To help the involved SCC and EeB projects in getting familiar with the tool and the guide, a series of monthly webinars will be organized. They will last an hour. The first one in December 2018 focused on the general setup of data forms and design data. The second in early January 2019 also included the provision of monitoring data. Our target audience of the upcoming webinars are active (currently running) projects, with a focus on 1) projects that approach closure and 2) projects that recently started (approximately in their first year, started in 2018).

The people with SRT access credentials will be invited personally and then, they can invite other people if deemed relevant.

REPLICATE Launches City-to-City 2019 Learning Programme

The City to City Learning Programme 2019 will organize 6 webinars among stakeholders in order to work on adaptability, scalability and singularity strategies. Each Lighthouse- and Follower City will host a session related to different topics such as energy, mobility, ICT or economic development. The webinars will be divided into three slots, guided by one or more experts from different project partners. The aim of the programme is to share the knowledge and experience of the collaborators involved in Replicate project.

The first event will be presented on the 5 February by the San Sebastian pilot partners Leycolan, Eurohelp and Ikusi and will deal with the excellence of service provision based on data monitoring and smart management.

Having been launched in 2016, SmartEnCity is approaching the end of its third year and is thus halfway through the project phase. Many of the planned technologies have been implemented in the three Lighthouse Cities Vitoria-Gasteiz, Tartu and Sonderborg, leading already to first replicable solutions. The task of the Follower Cities Lecce and Asenovgrad is to test the replication potential of the Lighthouse Cities' implementations to provide first-hand experiences to other cities interested in becoming a smart city and in improving their CO2 levels as well.

Once a city has become part of a EU-funded smart city project, the journey towards becoming a Smart City, however, is not over yet: on the contrary, it has just begun. The Lighthouse Cities of SmartEnCity have to successfully complete certain steps throughout the course of the project which need to be documented in project deliverables (partly confidential and partly publicly available). The press release thus provides an overview of the most important steps of a Lighthouse City (as an example for any city interested in this journey) on its way to becoming an actually Smart City.

Date: Thursday, 7 March 2019 10:00 - 16:00

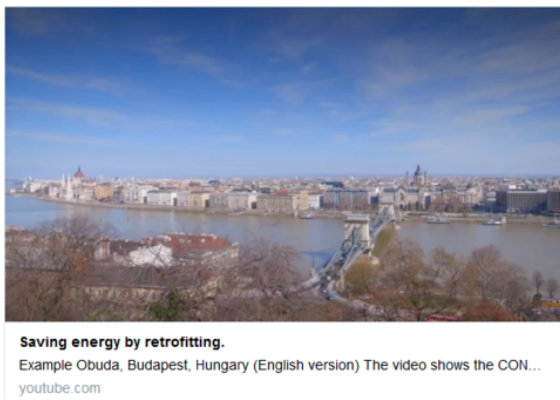
Location: Manchester, UK
