Apply now for the new call of the <u>Covenant</u> <u>twinning programme!</u>

The call for a new edition of the twinning programme of the European Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy is now open.

The Covenant twinning programme offers cities, regions and provinces across Europe

the opportunity to take part in twinning exchanges that aim to increase local authorities' capacity and knowledge to mitigate and adapt to climate change.

This new call enables European local and territorial authorities to participate in two types of exchanges, mentoring and peer-to-peer exchanges. All municipalities, regardless of size, are encouraged to apply as mentor, and those who do so will for the first time be able to take part in a mentors-only workshop!

For this call, a total of 6 twinning exchanges for municipalities and 1 exchange for territorial coordinators will be financed.

Local and regional authorities interested in participating in the programme should apply before 14 September 2018, 17:00 CET by submitting the online application form.

Communication is Key @ Strijp-S

Eindhoven, Lighthouse City of the <u>Triangulum</u> project, has compiled interesting insights into the subject of smart mobility solutions.

One interesting finding is that it is quite difficult to get people to change their daily parking routines. Therefore, thorough communication about new services and related privacy policy issues is very important.

One goal of the Smart Mobility program at Strijp-S was to present better and more precise parking management information to visitors. Examples are reserved (licence plate) parking, a guided parking route and detailed parking information.

By offering this new technology and related services, Strijp-S improved guidance and orientation in the area. By decreasing the time a visitor has to spend, e.g. on finding a parking spot, trips are made much more efficient, which in turn leads to substantially less CO2 emissions.
