There will be a joint SCIS/EIP-SCC/EC stakeholder engagement session on the Horizon Europe cities mission. The main outcome of the session will be fed back directly into the mission board of the Cities Mission. This is your chance to influence and make your voice heard!

Moreover, there will be an informal Get Together for the wider SCIS/EIP-SCC and European Smart Cities and Communities Lighthouse Projects (SCC1) community: Do I hear DRINKS?! Inspired by the Apollo 11 mission to put a man on the moon, the European R&I Missions aim to deliver solutions to some of the greatest challenges facing our world, such as cancer, climate change, healthy oceans, climate-neutral cities and healthy soil and food. At the occasion of the Informal Council for Research Ministers in Helsinki, Finland, Commissioner Moedas announced the appointment of five prominent experts to chair the mission boards, which will propose targets and timelines to design the specific missions.
