### **Smart Cities Information System – finding solutions**



'With 75% of EU citizens living in cities, cities are part of the problem, but also represent the solution'. The first European Smart Cities Project Coordinators Meeting took place on 13th October 2015 under the theme 'How to Maximise the Replication Potential of Energy Efficient Buildings and Smart Cities Projects'. It brought together project leaders, town planners and architects to discuss their experiences from managing projects. The goal of the meeting was to gain feedback on ways to efficiently process information through the Smart Cities Information System (SCIS) web platform and to ensure project replication across Europe.

**Eric Lecomte, EC Policy Officer,** opening the meeting, said the SCIS portal should offer solutions for those setting up Smart City initiatives, and not just illustrate the potential problems. 'Challenges appear at every stage. The SCIS should represent a One-Stop-Shop for sharing information and experience.'

The **SCIS** is a continuation of the **Concerto** series of initiatives, which began in 2005. Several of the Concerto funded projects were showcased (including CELSIUS, DIRECTION and PIME'S). Those present stressed the need for reliable data, and noted the challenges created by public authorities and local

regulations whilst highlighting the many cultural, climatic and socio-economic differences in projects. All the meeting participants agreed that Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) should take into account not only the synergies of projects, but also their individual features.

Architects and town planners insisted that the SCIS database needed to assist in the goal of making projects financially viable in the long term through ongoing collaboration with national, regional and local authorities. 'Energy efficiency needs to be considered in the design stage not just as an add-on at the end of the project', said one architect. 'Yet currently it carries too much financial risk.' As well as developing a **project database** from which KPIs can be calculated based on data from Smart Cities initiatives, the SCIS team will produce analysis and recommendations that will contribute to policy development in the field.

Project coordinators talked of the many skill sets that are required for ensuring that projects are successful – 'it can sometimes be about knowing how to communicate with people and ensuring they can talk to one another to find synergies amongst themselves' said one Project Coordinator based in Norway and coordinating projects in Hungary and the Basque country. 'That and a long-term commitment to making it work!' These skills may not be recorded in a database, but they are still important.

Success prediction is not always obvious either. As one participant said 'it depends... on many factors', but the database will be useful if it creates 'a catalogue of good solutions to steer projects through potential obstacles'. Participants at the meeting agreed that the possibility to meet at the Smart Cities Project Co-ordinators Meeting added extra value to the learning and knowledge transfer process. They requested further meetings with a variety of common themes.

The **conclusions** from the meeting are as follows:

- On **KPIs**: they should be general enough, and specific enough to cover diversity;
- On **user groups**: to position themselves in their local environment with the right data from the database;
- Storytelling approach: learning opportunity at every stage (technology, life cycle etc.);
- Differences: cultural, political, socio-economic and climatic angles;
- Long-term goal: making projects financially viable and low risk;
- Website: less technocratic, more user-centric, fewer problems and more solutions;
- **Common methodology**: to follow up consistently a holistic approach.
